




ELEMENTARY PROGRAM (GRADES 1-8)

The Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD)

J. Addison School believes in the value of completing a secondary education. It is required that students in the province of Ontario remain in school until he or she has reached the age of eighteen or obtained an Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD).

The requirements for earning an Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) are as follows:

- Students must earn a minimum of 30 credits, including 18 compulsory credits and 12 optional credits;
- Students must meet the provincial secondary school literacy requirement; and
- Students must complete 40 hours of community involvement activities.

Guide to Determining Diploma Requirements for Students Transferring into Ontario Secondary Schools

For regular day school students who are transferring from a home school, private school, or a school outside of Ontario, principals will grant equivalent credits for placement purposes through the Prior Learning Assessment and Recognition (PLAR) process, based on their evaluation of the student's previous learning. Equivalency credits will be recorded on the Ontario Student Transcript.

Prior Learning Assesment

Prior Learning and Assessment and Recognition (PLAR) is a formal evaluation and accreditation process. Students obtain credits towards the secondary school diploma (OSSD) for knowledge and skills that they have acquired outside of secondary school. This prior learning is evaluated to see if the student has met provincial course expectations. A student may "challenge" a specific course for credit or obtain credits through the "equivalency" process if they have credentials from schools outside Ontario.









INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS & COURSE EXPECTATIONS

J. Addison recognizes the needs of international students coming to a high school in a foreign country can be a daunting experience for any teenager. To ease the transition, J. Addison provides several programs designed especially for international students. All international students are required to attend an **International Student Orientation.** This program introduces the students to the school and its policies, enables them to make schedule adjustments and to take care of necessary arrangements (e.g. books, uniform, etc.) prior to the actual start of classes.

Orientation also provides a time for international students to meet their peers, get acquainted with their new school, and ask questions to faculty and staff. Placement testing is also conducted at this time. During the school year, J. Addison offers ESL (English as a Second Language courses. We also provide opportunities for international students to make a smooth transition to our high school through our Multi-cultural Club and International Buddy program. These organizations provide social opportunities outside of the classroom.



BOARDING SCHOOL PROGRAM

The decision of studying abroad is an exciting one! Understanding that our students are miles away from their families and home countries, J. Addison staff endeavor to provide a safe, comfortable and nurturing living environment which they can call their home away from home. Our Boarding Program is currently available to students in Grades 7 – 12.

Residence Life provides students with valuable experience in becoming independent and responsible young adults. Living with peers encourages social interaction, which in turn strengthens their interpersonal communication skills and thus, improves emotional intelligence. Close friendships flourish frequently, which students can cherish and cultivate for the rest of their lives. We have a dedicated team of compassionate and knowledgeable residence counsellors providing care and guidance to all boarding students, from personal counselling, to academic support and community activities; also, safeguarding the interests and safety of our students through regular communication and meetings with parents and guardians.

OUR RESIDENCE HALLS


Erie & Simcoe Hall

At J. Addison School, our Boarding Program provides a home-away-from-home with our residence halls.

Erie Hall and Simcoe Hall are both co-ed residences with open concept shared rooms. Students will have their own area furnished with single bed, desk, chair, and closet. Each room has its own bathroom. Only students of the same gender and of similar age will be assigned to live in the same room.

Huron Hall

Huron Hall is currently an all-male residence on-site featuring compartment concept shared rooms. Students will have their own private cubicle furnished with single bed, desk, chair, and closet. The partition design provides an extra layer of privacy but still offer the benefits of communal and social living.



Every room in our residences is equipped with a shared bathroom. Each residence hall is also equipped with a student lounge, kitchenette/snack preparation area, and self-service laundry room. 


ELEMENTARY PROGRAM (GRADES 1-8)

The Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD)

J. Addison School believes in the value of completing a secondary education. It is required that students in the province of Ontario remain in school until he or she has reached the age of eighteen or obtained an Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD).

The requirements for earning an Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) are as follows:

- Students must earn a minimum of 30 credits, including 18 compulsory credits and 12 optional credits;
- Students must meet the provincial secondary school literacy requirement; and
- Students must complete 40 hours of community involvement activities.

Guide to Determining Diploma Requirements for Students Transferring into Ontario Secondary Schools

For regular day school students who are transferring from a home school, private school, or a school outside of Ontario, principals will grant equivalent credits for placement purposes through the Prior Learning Assessment and Recognition (PLAR) process, based on their evaluation of the student's previous learning. Equivalency credits will be recorded on the Ontario Student Transcript.

The above is for reference only, the final number of credits recognized is based on individual assessment which will be equivalent to the Ontario secondary program.

Prior Learning Assesment

Prior Learning and Assessment and Recognition (PLAR) is a formal evaluation and accreditation process. Students obtain credits towards the secondary school diploma (OSSD) for knowledge and skills that they have acquired outside of secondary school. This prior learning is evaluated to see if the student has met provincial course expectations. A student may "challenge" a specific course for credit or obtain credits through the "equivalency" process if they have credentials from schools outside Ontario.









BOARDING SCHOOL PROGRAM




CAFÉ J - FOOD AND CATERING SERVICES
