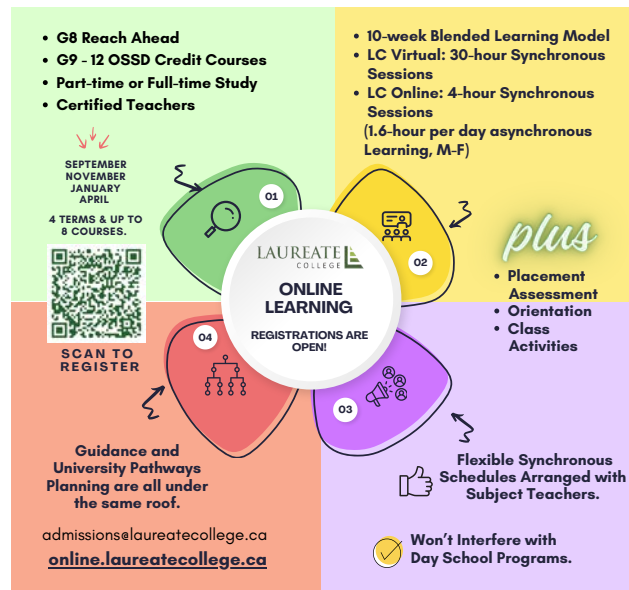

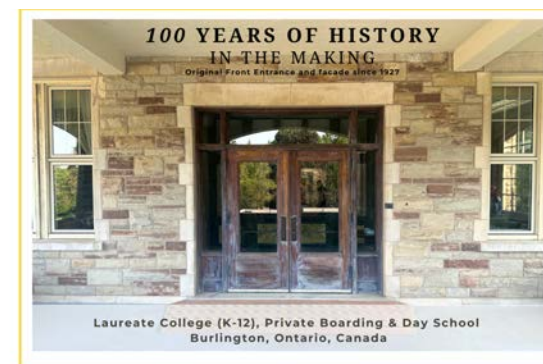

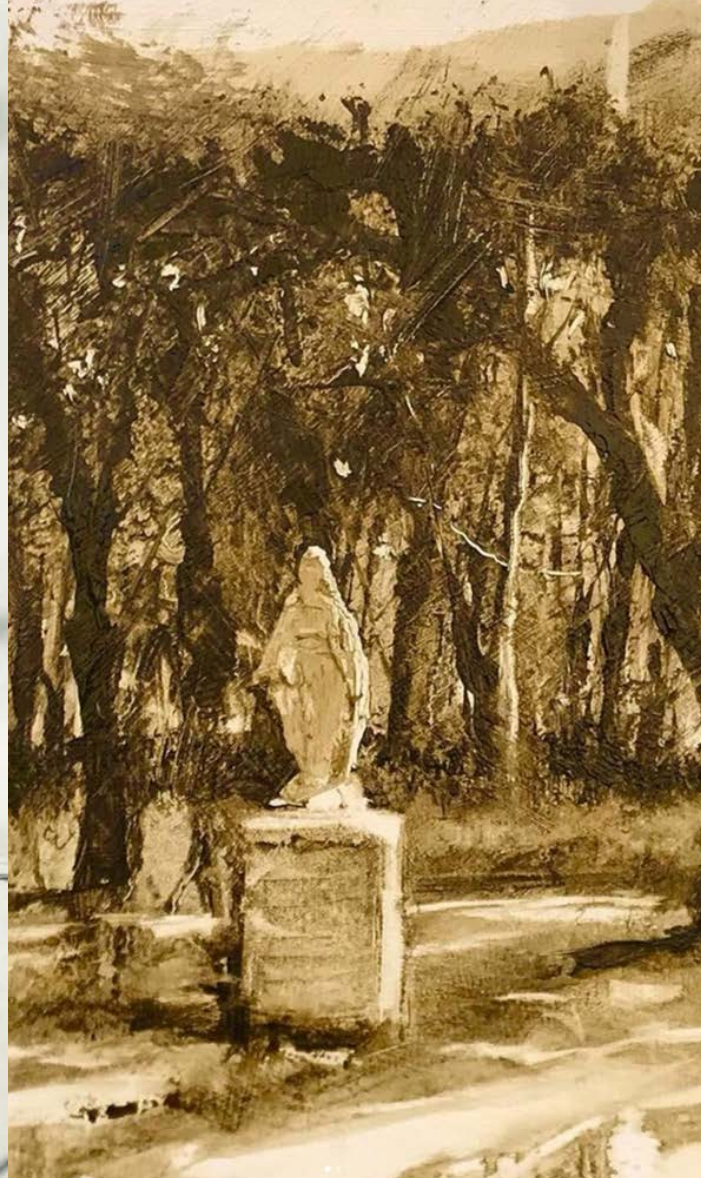

These special events may include performances, community arts or arts council participation, etc. As part of the Arts Certificate, an art student must complete the Laureate Passport of at least five activities each year.

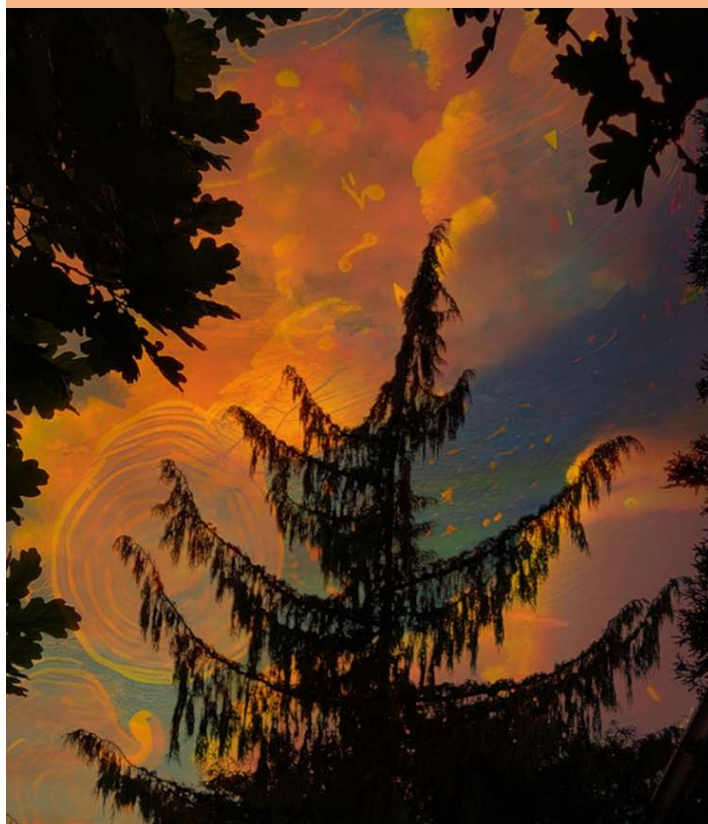
POST-SECONDARY PATHWAYS
