

All students participate in programmed physical education each day. Teachers take the same care in planning these classes as they would any other, setting specific goals for each individual. Our programme involves stretching, cardio, and skill development. We play volleyball, basketball and badminton in our full-size gymnasium, and outdoor sports on two acres of natural play space. Outside play is especially important — natural light effects both eyesight and mood.

The results of our programme have been outstanding. The benefits include enhanced social and emotional development. Students head out to other classes with greater focus and increased self-esteem, ready to work together in a spirit of collaboration.
