Introduction

Many schools talk about putting students first, but are too large to give students individual mentoring and support. That's why TPS, with its small class sizes, variety of extracurricular activities, and excellent post-secondary placement rates, has become a top option for discerning students.

Parents know that superior schools prepare children for all of life's tests — not just today's. That's why TPS students take a full load of university preparatory courses covering the liberal arts and sciences.

A variety of course electives are an added bonus for TPS. We offer classes in Fashion Design, Art, Drama, Communication Technology, Media Arts and Computer Science in addition to all the core courses. This preparation provides students with the broad educational background and variety of problemsolving skills they'll need for their future studies. Students also benefit from a semestered curriculum, taking only four courses at a time. They balance their studies with extracurricular activities including competitive sports and fine arts.

Another TPS signature is their later start time: 10:00 a.m. Research shows later starts have positive effects on academic performance and students gain health benefits from extra sleep. Days at TPS are also structured so students can get extra help from their teachers at whatever time is best for them: in the morning before class starts, after school, or even on Saturdays.

House System

All students and staff (except for the Principal) are allocated to Houses. Each is a member of that House for life.

The House system provides a framework for intramural, athletic, charity fundraising, and community competitions. Points are awarded for participation in all facets of school life including academic achievement, effort, good deeds, and volunteer work.

Intended to foster individual growth and create student relationships across all grade levels, houses participate in school wide contests resulting in more positive interaction between juniors and seniors and a sense of unity. Each House has a House Captain and Vice-Captain selected from the Grade 12 students. Staff members are instrumental in the organization and planning of strategy and selection of House representatives.

At the end of the school year members of the House with the most House Points are rewarded with an excursion. An annual trophy will be presented to the House with the most points and reside in their possession until the following year's competition comes to a close.















Our Campus


Toronto Prep School is located in the heart of midtown Toronto. Our campus is on the north east corner of Davisville Ave., and Mt. Pleasant Rd. We provide 42,750 square feet of learning over two floors. Our classrooms are bright, spacious and specifically designed to host a maximum of 16 students per class.

We take advantage of the amenities surrounding our campus such as GoodLife Fitness, June Rowlands Park, Moore Park, and Leaside Memorial Gardens Arena. Our off campus facilities include the Eglinton Grand where we hold our annual TPS Prom, Spirit/Sports Awards and our Arts Night, the Ontario Science Centre for our annual commencement ceremony, and Sassafraz for our annual dinner dance honouring our Grade 12 graduates and their parents.



A Message from Admissions

Thank you for your interest in the Toronto Prep School. Our Admissions Office realizes the significance of a family's decision to consider an independent school and it is our goal that our admission process will be informative, constructive and a favourable experience.

The Toronto Prep School seeks to enroll a group of diverse students. We follow an open admission policy, whereby qualified candidates are admitted without an entrance test, but rather on assessment for evidence of good character, maturity, and academic motivation. The Admission Committee evaluates each applicant on the basis of personal interview, academic record, teacher and community recommendations.

Our Admissions package, which can be downloaded or picked up at our Main Office, includes all the documentation necessary to complete the admissions process. You will also find a prepared checklist to help you organize and complete the application forms. We are pleased to learn of your interest in our school, and look forward to meeting both you and your family.

We are committed to developing students who are confident and responsible, and exhibit the values necessary to become effective communicators, informed and productive thinkers, self-directed learners, collaborative workers, skilled information processors, and problem solvers.

Application

01. Our admissions process is a chance to explore. It is designed to help parents and the prospective candidate make the most informed educational decision. We strive to enable the candidate, his or her family and the School to learn as much as possible about each other in order to determine the suitability of Toronto Prep School environment for each applicant. The journey always begins and ends with the individual candidate. The process enables your family to determine if Toronto Prep School is right for you, does it meet your requirements, is it conducive to your learning style, and does it offer you the opportunity to achieve your goals and ambitions, while affording the school the opportunity to discern the compatibility of each candidate with our education philosophy and expectations. We want to discover who the candidate really is and as such, rely on a detailed application package (including a teacher and community referral, school reports, parent statement and a self assessment completed by the candidate) and an interview rather than writing an SSAT or entrance test. Once a completed application is received, the Director of Admissions will contact the candidate's parents via email or telephone to arrange an interview.

The interview is at the heart of the evaluation process for all parties and will include both the candidate and the parents, together and individually. The dialogue is a cooperative discussion where the candidate is able to communicate their aspirations, needs and wants, passions, talents, attitudes and values, the parents are able to ascertain the role the school will play in their child's development including curriculum and support programs, and the school will evaluate the candidate's academic motivation, personality, character, interests and how they learn. Through the application and interview process we will endeavour to evaluate if the candidate and Toronto Prep School are a compatible fit. The goal of Toronto Prep School is to find those students who best fit with our program and values. Students are not chosen merely by their academic qualifications, though these of course play an important part in any decision. We are looking for students who want to be a part of our dynamic community, who are concerned about the wider society and are willing to share their talents and improve their skills. We stress the importance of extra-curricular activities and place effort and character above all.

Decision

03.

Admission decisions are made by the Admissions Committee, which is comprised of the Director of Admissions, the Principal, and three senior Faculty members. The Admissions Committee reviews all applications immediately following the interview process and determines if there is a need for any further information or documentation. The Committee will make a final decision within three days of the completion of the interview process. Parents will be contacted via email and a letter will be mailed to inform the candidate whether they have been accepted, wait-listed or declined. If a candidate is accepted, an acceptance offer and a registration package will be issued. If a candidate is wait-listed, he or she will be notified only if space becomes available. If a candidate is declined, no further review will take place. The candidate is welcome to reapply for the following school year.

For successful candidates, acceptance of the offer is acknowledged by submitting the completed registration forms and the registration fee which guarantees your space at the School. Upon completion of the registration process, a meeting will be scheduled for the student and parents with the Principal, Vice-Principal, or Guidance for course selection. Descriptions of each course can be found on the school website.
