Teens with a complex IEP, identifying learning difficulties associated with attention disorders, in combination with significant anxiety/depression, or complications due to family circumstances.

Teens who are diagnosed, as well as undiagnosed, with high-functioning ASD.

Teacher and student rapport builds strong relationships, that re-engage learning, curiosity, initiative and confidence.





Smaller classes deliver bigger results.

Our Dynamic IEP

Every student is assessed for their support needs, in order to develop their individual Dynamic IEP - a living document that is routinely evaluated, updated, and evolving according to each student's term-to-term objectives, challenges and goals.



Rapport-based learning

Teachers take time to establish a rapport with students, built on open and honest communication, common ground, mutual respect, accountability and understanding.

This lays the foundation for us to re-engage their learning, develop new habits, inspire curiosity, initiative, and build confidence.



The Therapeutic Program

AVRO's Therapeutic Program provides students and parents regular, on-site professional support for both academic and emotional challenges. Our aim is to support the psycho-social needs of our students, in addition to their education.

The program uses a variety of therapeutic modalities, such as Cognitive Behavioural Therapy, mindfulness, as well as music and expressive arts therapy, to enhance creativity and develop a sense of enjoyment in learning. Thanks to this program, our school is a space where students feel at home and know their educational and emotional needs are acknowledged and always met.

Our team works together to create community in a learning environment that nurtures positive social interactions, while providing the academic support that each student needs.

Our Programs: Grades 9-12

FULL TIME PROGRAM

Full-time students can take up to eight credits over four terms, during the academic year. In each eight week term, students focus on two or three credits. Any students who demonstrate excellent progress and time-management may be eligible to take additional courses during the year.

PART TIME PROGRAM

AVRO's part-time program allows students to take a course during the day or after-school while remaining full-time students at their home high schools. We offer part-time students the same small class size and individualized learning approach that we offer full-time students. All students benefit from the same excellent teaching team and support.

THERAPEUTIC PROGRAM


Our therapeutic program operates within the regular school program, providing students and parents on-site professional support. Founder, Jason Ellenbogen MSW, RSW, works one-on-one with teens, alongside additional support staff, including guidance teachers and psycho-educational consultants who help develop and provide individual support.

SUMMER PROGRAM

Our summer credit classes are small and personalized. Each credit runs four weeks to maximize the learning and provide students the opportunity to fast track or strengthen their knowledge base. Summer courses focus on Math, Science & English - all designed to positively engage students in the intensive, four week experience.


