



Earning the OSSD with VHS


We ensure that every student has the opportunity to earn their Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD), regardless of where they live or where they have been educated.

Earn Your OSSD Using Equivalent Credits

With Equivalent Credit Assessments, students have the opportunity to earn their OSSD using

- ✓ credits earned at other schools
- ✓ credits earned outside of Ontario

Equivalent credits are OSSD credits that can be issued if a student has met the equivalent standards of an OSSD course outside of Ontario. Determining equivalency involves an assessment of the student's credentials as shown on their transcripts and/or report cards. VHS can grant up to 24 equivalent credits at the discretion of the principal and VHS Guidance team.





Earn Your OSSD Exclusively at VHS

VHS offers all Compulsory courses and a variety of Optional course options. This means that students can earn their diploma exclusively with VHS. The completion of other OSSD requirements, such as the Provincial Secondary School Literacy Requirement and community involvement component, can also all be arranged through the



The OSSD Requirements



30 Credits

Before graduating from high school, students must earn a minimum of 30 credits (18 compulsory, and 12 optional).

OSSLT

Students who wish to earn the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) must write the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT). Typically the test is written while students are in Grade 10. This test determines whether students meet the minimum standard for literacy (reading and writing) across all subject areas to the end of Grade 9 as outlined in the Ontario curriculum. Students who are unsuccessful can take the test again, or (if eligible) complete the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Course (OSSLC).

Community Involvement

Before graduating from high school, students must complete a minimum of 40 hours of unpaid community involvement activities. These volunteer hours are intended to promote community values by involving students in their community in a positive and contributive manner.***

- credits in English (1 credit per grade)*
- 3 credits in Mathematics (1 credit in Grade11 or 12).
- 2 credits in Science
- 1 credit in Canadian History
- 1 credit in Canadian Geography
- 1 credit in the Arts
- 1 credit in Health and Physical Education
- 1 credit in French as a second language
- 0.5 credit in Career Studies
- 0.5 credit in Civics

1 Group 1

one credit in English or French as a second language, a Native language, or a classical or international language, or social sciences and the humanities, or Canadian and world studies, or guidance and career education

1 Group 2

one credit in health and physical education, or the arts, or business studies, or French as a second language**

1 Group 3

one credit in science in Grade 11 or 12, or technological education, or French as a second language, or computer studies**

12 Optional

12 optional credits (chosen based on interests and post-secondary requirements)

^{*} A maximum of 3 credits in English as a second language (ESL) or English literacy development (ELD) may be counted towards the 4 compulsory credits in English, but the fourth must be a credit earned for a Grade 12 compulsory English course.

^{**} Only 2 additional second language credits (either French or English) can be counted as compulsory: one in Group 1, and one in either Group 2 or Group 3.

^{***} Students completing fewer than four years of high school in Ontario may have a reduced number of community involvement hours to complete. This will be determined by your VHS guidance coordinator.

Supporting ESL Learners


The programs of study offered by VHS must be flexible in order to accommodate the needs of students who require instruction in English as a second language (ESL) or English literacy development. Teachers are responsible for helping students to develop their English abilities.

Students who enrol at VHS have the opportunity during registration to provide information about their English language learning background, including the number of years they have been learning English. This information guides the instruction of VHS teachers and the accommodations they provide.

VHS also supports English Language Learners through partnerships with third-party services such as free online tutoring through GradeSlam, and English placement tests with Off2Class.

Unlimited Online Tutoring Support

VHS students have access to 24/7, unlimited online tutoring support through GradeSlam. This service comes at no additional cost to students.









VHS course design focuses on student experience. Our courses are created with flexibility, differentiated instruction, and choice, to accommodate and respond to individual learner needs.










Learning Environment
